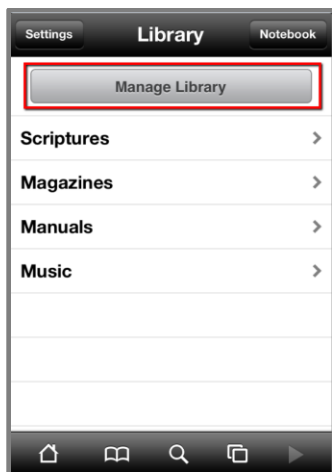


How to Show Videos without an Internet Connection: Using an Apple Device

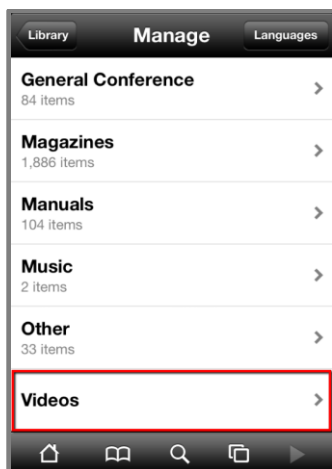
The Media Library has many videos you can play to help you teach gospel principles and enhance your gospel lessons. However, streaming the video over the meetinghouse's Internet connection is not always a possibility. To avoid potential problems with streaming, you can download the video ahead of time and then play it from a mobile device. However, please be aware there are a few videos in the Media Library that are not available for download. This is due to copyright and intellectual property laws. We are striving to make as many of these videos available for download as possible, but in the meantime, those few videos will require Internet access to play.

If you have an Apple tablet or smartphone, you can download videos through the [Gospel Library app](#). Here are the instructions for downloading and showing videos on an Apple device:

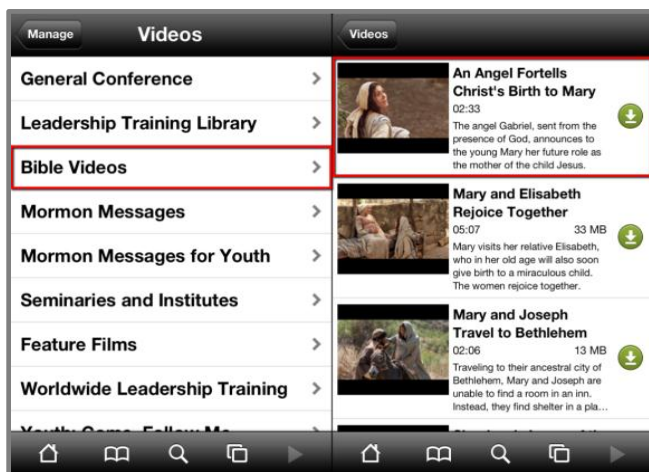
1. Go to the Manage Library section of the Gospel Library app.



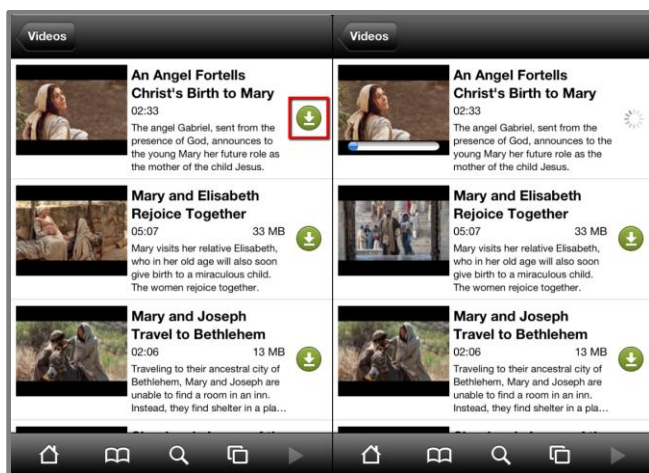
2. Select Videos from the menu.



3. Select the genre your video belongs to (for example, Mormon Messages, Youth: Come Follow Me, and so on), and navigate to the video you want.



4. Press the download button, and the video will begin downloading to your device.



5. After you download the video, return to the home menu. You can find the downloaded video in the Videos section of your library.



****Note about Apple devices:**

There is currently no option to download video files directly from the Media Library website using the Safari web browser on an Apple device, which is why we recommend the Gospel Library app. You can, however, search for and download other mobile apps that will allow you to browse the Internet, download video files from the Media Library site, and store them in that app. If you choose this option, we recommend searching the Internet for an app that will allow you to do this, making sure to research any app before you download it to your device.
